Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) for Logging Operations

- 1. Safety Glasses
- 2. Hard hat
- 3. Hearing Protection
- 4. Gloves
- 5. Steel toe shoes

Pre-Operations Machine Inspection

- 6. Fluid checks
- 7. Walk around
- 8. Inspection for leaks—oil on ground
- 9. Inspection of tires and lugs
- 10. Inspect saw head—teeth, holders, accumulator arms
- 11. Record in maintenance book

Proper Equipment Mounting & Dismounting

- 12. Maintain 3-point contact at all times—1 hand 2 feet, etc.
- 13. Awareness of mounting/dismounting hazards—mud on steps, holes uneven ground, etc.

Operator Controls-Machine Start-Up and Company Practices

- 14. Equipment Specific Gauges/Indicators/Links
- 15. Equipment Specific Operations Procedures and applicable company policies
- 16. Warm up procedures/policies
- 17. Always test controls
- 18. Seatbelt/Hard hat/Idling policies
- 19. Ground personnel (typical/unannounced/clearances/notification procedures

Operator Shut Down Procedures (All instances and end of day)

- 20. Never leave cab of machine while any saw/arm/processing head is running
- 21. Always ground saw head
- 22. Park on most optimal elevation/angle available—Engage parking brake!
- 23. Lower all attachments
- 24. Overnight—ensure master switch is disconnected
- 25. Specific Lock Out Tag Out procedures
